READING YOUR CHILD'S REPORT

As we near the end of the year, it's time to turn our attention to school reports. Reports can mean anxious times for children. Will my parents be disappointed or proud? This is the main concern of most children. Kids of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Before you rip open the sealed envelope containing the report do a little self-check to see if you are in the right frame of mind:

1. Are your expectations for your son or daughter realistic and in line with their ability?

Expectations are tricky. If they are too high then kids can be turned off learning. Too low and there is nothing to strive for. Pitch your expectations in line with your child's abilities. A quick check of your child's last report cards may provide you with a good yardstick.

2. Do you believe that children learn at different rates?

There are slow bloomers, late developers and steady-as-you-go kids in every classroom, so avoid comparing your child to siblings, your friends' children and even yourself when you were a child. Instead look for individual progress.

3 Are you willing to safeguard your child's self-esteem rather than deflate it?

Self-confidence is a prerequisite for learning, so be prepared to be as positive and encouraging as possible.

Finally...

Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, then you cannot ask any more than that, regardless of the grading.

After reports are read and discussed celebrate your child's efforts with a special activity or treat. In this way you will recognise progress and remind them that the holidays are just around the corner when they can forget about assessment, tests and reports for a while.



TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Each Friday, students in K Starfish, K Waves and K/1 Reef all combine classes to engage in rotational maths groups. Students are divided into 10 groups across the classrooms to consolidate a variety of maths concepts and skills.

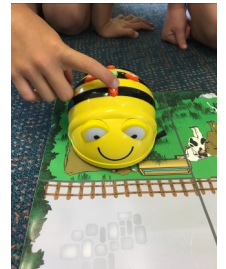
Students have been excited and incredibly fortunate to begin to work with more technology in these rotations thanks to the introduction of iPads and Bee-Bots!
